Lighthouse Legends Rock the Boys' & Girls' Club Gym

This past October 12, several hundred fans bobbed their heads, rocked out, or partner danced to the sounds of the Legends of the Lighthouse band reunion concert.

Fifteen bands played their way through the memory banks of the music of the 50's, 60's, 70's, and beyond reuniting a host of musicians who played in the Club's Lighthouse decades ago.

Ric Fetridge, one of the principal organizers, said, "All of us got our start at the club. It was our first paying job. We got paid in one dollar bills." Some of the bands and artists included The John Harding band, Zarvis Allen, the Continentals, Mick Valenti, and David Grover.

"Rick and Wendy Fetridge did a tremendous job putting that show on. That was as professional a show as one is going to see," said Terry Hughes, Club executive director.

"To see those 'grandparents' jamming and rocking and rolling like they were 20 again was motivating for me. The music is in their blood, and they grew up here on that stuff."

For the second year in a row The Alumni Committee served as a work crew for the concert selling tickets, ushering, answering questions, and other activities as needed.


